General Precaurions

⚠ WARNING		
	Do not touch the safety switch inside the machine. High voltage that can cause electric shock may result. Injury may also result from the turning of gears.	
	Do not use flammable sprays near the machine. Fire may result due to the high temperature parts inside the machine.	
	If the cover becomes abnormally hot, smoke is emitted, or a strange smell or noise is emitted, remove the power plug from the outlet and contact your dealer. Fire may result.	
	If liquid such as water enters the inside of the machine, remove the power plug from the outlet and contact your dealer. Fire may result.	
	If a foreign object such as a paper clip is dropped inside the machine, remove the power plug from the outlet and contact your dealer. Electrocution, fire, or injury may result.	
	Do not operate or assemble the machine except as indicated in the user's manual. Electrocution, fire, or injury may result.	
	If the machine is dropped or the cover is damaged, remove the power plug from the outlet and contact your dealer. Electrocution, fire, or injury may result.

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Unpacking

How to Unpack the Machine



Packaging and cushioning materials are used for transporting the machine. Do not dispose of them, and keep them for future use.

- ▶ Remove the machine from the box, and then remove the cushioning material and plastic bag.
- ▶ Lift the machine, and then place it where it is to be installed.





Checking the Accessories

Check that you have everything shown below.

Be sure to use the consumables supplied with the machine first. If consumables other than the supplied ones are installed first, the life time may not be shown correctly or supplied consumables may become unusable.

Toner Cartridge

A toner cartridge can print approximately 5,000 pages (reference value based on DTM Print GmbH tests printing simplex 1 inch square black mark patterns).

Guide Rib



Power Cord

A LAN cable and USB cable are not included. Prepare cables suitable for the connection environment.

Packaging, cushioning materials, and cover toner are used for transporting the machine. Do not dispose of them, and keep them for future use.




Installing Consumables


Do not turn the power of the machine on.

- ▶ Install the consumables after confirming that the power of the machine is off.
- Use extra care when handling the image drum (the glossy cylinder), because it is fragile.
- ▶ Do not expose the image drum unit to direct sunlight or strong light (approximately 1,500 lux or more). Do not leave the image drum unit exposed for 5 minutes or more, even under room lighting. When the image drum unit will be left alone for 5 minutes or more, cover it with black paper, etc. to prevent it from being exposed to light.


Insert your finger into the recess on the top of the machine and pull up the lever.




Open the top cover until it stops.




Peel off the protective tape.



Peel off the protective tape, and remove the desiccant.




Remove the cover toner.








Using the Machine



Installation

Installation Environment

Install the machine in the following environment.

► Ambient temperature: 10°C to 32°C

Ambient humidity: 20% to 80% RH (relative humidity)

► Maximum wet bulb temperature: 25°C



- Use care to prevent condensation. It may cause a malfunction.
- If you install the machine in a location whose ambient humidity is 30% RH or below, use a humidifier or antistatic mat.
- Depending on the installation environment, the machine may emit bothering operation noise. If the noise bothers you, we suggest the machine be installed in a location away from you or in another room.

! WARNING

- Do not install the machine in a location subject to high temperatures or in a location near fire.
- Do not install the machine in a location where chemical reactions may occur (such as a laboratory).
- Do not install the machine near alcohol, thinners, or other flammable solvents.
- Do not install the machine in a location within the reach of small children.
- Do not install the machine in an unstable location (such as on an unsteady stand or slanted location).
- Do not install the machine in a location subject to high level of humidity, dust, or direct sunlight.
- Do not install the machine in an environment exposed to salty air or corrosive gas.
- Do not install the machine in a location subject to much vibration.
- Do not install the machine in a location where its vent hole is blocked.

! CAUTION

- Do not install the machine directly on a thick rug or carpet.
- Do not install the machine in a location with bad circulation and ventilation such as a closed room.
- Make sure to ventilate the room if you use the machine in a small room continuously for an extended period of time.
- Install this machine away from a source that emits strong magnetic fields or noise.
- Install this machine away from a monitor or television.




Install the machine on a flat surface that is wide enough to accommodate the legs of the machine.

Top View








Front View



No.	Name	Description
1	Top Cover	The top cover of the machine. Close this when printing.
2	Top Cover Lever	Use this to open the top cover.
3	LCD Panel	Indicates the status of the machine and the settings.
4	Toner Cartridge Cover	Opens and closes when replacing the toner cartridge.
5	Power ON/OFF Switch	The power switch cover. Open the cover to find the power switch.
6	Paper Outlet	Outputs printed paper.
7	Air Outlet	The air vent.
8	Buzzer	The buzzer. Can be set to sound when an error occurs in the machine.



9	Feeder Cover	The cover of the paper feeder.
10	Feeder Cover Lever	Use this to open the feeder cover.
11	AC Inlet	The terminal for the power cable.
12	Paper Inlet	Load paper here.
13	Paper Sensor	The sensor for detecting the paper.
14	Paper Guide	Align this with the paper width.
15	Paper Guide Lever	Fixes the Paper Guide.





Installing the Wireless LAN Module


Install the Wireless LAN Module to connect the machine and a computer via wireless LAN.




Turn off the machine.

Insert the Wireless LAN Module into the connector on the side of the machine.




Attach the Wireless LAN Module anywhere on the machine using the supplied hook-and-loop fastener.





Turn the machine on while holding «OK» button on the operation panel.


► Hold «OK» button until [BOOT MENU] is displayed on the screen.



When [BOOT MENU] is displayed, release your finger and press «OK» button again.



When [ENTER PASSWORD] is displayed, enter the password.




► The default password is "999999."

When the password has been entered, press OK button.



Press ∧ button or ∨ button to display [WIRELESS MODULE], and press «OK» button.



Press \wedge button or \vee button to display [ENABLE], and press OK button.

▶ * is displayed on the right edge of the bottom of the screen.



Press «ONLINE» button to return to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.





Installing the Presenter Unit

The Presenter Unit is installed to retain the printed paper in the outlet without ejecting it.


When installation of the Presenter Unit is complete, set the Presenter Unit to [ENABLE] on the operation panel.

Turn off the machine.



- Press OK button.
- When [ENTER PASSWORD] is displayed, enter the password.
 - ► The default password is "999999."
- When the password has been entered, press O» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [OTHERS SETUP].
- Press OK button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [PRESENTER UNIT].
- Press OK button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display [ENABLE], and press OK button.
- The machine restarts and returns to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.

- Turning On or Off the Machine
- About the Power Supply
- Ensure the following conditions for the power supply.
- CX86e: 110 to 127V AC (Range 99 to 140V AC)
- CX86e: 220 to 240V AC (Range 198 to 264V AC)
- Power frequency: 50/60 Hz ± 2%

If the power supply is unstable, use a voltage regulator. The maximum power consumption of the machine is 650W. Check that the power supply is sufficient. Operation is not guaranteed if an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) or inverter is used. Do not use an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) or inverter.

- Be sure to turn off the machine before connecting and disconnecting the power cord and the ground wire.
- Be sure to connect the ground wire to the designated ground terminal.
- If the machine cannot be grounded, contact your dealer.

 Be sure not to connect the ground wire to a water pipe, a gas pipe, the ground terminal of a telephone line, or a lightning rod.
- Be sure to connect the ground wire before connecting the power cord to the outlet.

 Also, be sure to unplug the power cord from the outlet before disconnecting the ground wire.


 Be sure to hold the power plug when plugging in or unplugging the power cord.
- Be sure to insert the power cord fully into the power outlet.
 Do not plug in or unplug the power cord with wet hands.
 Install the power cord in a location where users cannot step on it, and do not place any object on the power cord.
- Do not bundle or tie the power cord Do not use a damaged power cord.
- Do not overload the outlet.
- Do not connect the power cords of this machine and other electric products to the same outlet. If the power cord of this machine is connected to the same outlet as other electric products, especially an air conditioner, copier, or shredder, this machine may malfunction due to electrical noise. If you have to connect the power cord of this machine to the same outlet as other products, use a commercially available noise filter or noise cut transformer.
- Use the power cord included in this machine, and plug the cord directly into the outlet. Do not use the power cords of other products for this machine.
- Do not use an extension cord. If you have to use an extension cord, use a cord rated 10A or higher.
- If you use an extension cord, this machine may not work properly due to AC voltage drop.
- Do not turn off this machine or unplug the power cord while printing.
- If you do not use this machine for an extended period of time at occasions such as holidays or trips, unplug the power cord from the outlet.
- Do not use the power cord included in this machine for other products.






Connect the power cable to the power connector on the rear of the machine.



Insert the power plug into the outlet.




Open the cover on the front left of the machine and press and hold the power switch for approximately one second.




Turning Off the Machine

Open the cover on the front left of the machine and press and hold the power switch for one second.




Wait until [SHUTTING DOWN. PLEASE WAIT/TURN OFF AUTOMATICALLY] is displayed on the operation panel and the operation panel turns off.

Remove the power plug from the outlet.

Remove the power cable from the power connector on the rear of the machine.



When you want to shutdown the machine forcefully, press and hold the power switch for more than 5 seconds.



Connecting a LAN Cable

A LAN cable can be used to connect the machine to a computer via a wired network.


Before installing the printer driver, connect the printer to the network using a LAN cable.


Prepare a LAN cable and hub.



Make sure that the machine and the computer are turned off.

Insert the LAN cable into the network interface connector of the machine.





Insert the other end of the LAN cable into the hub.

Connecting via Wireless LAN

Preparing to Connect via Wireless LAN

Connecting via an Access Point

Check whether your wireless LAN access point supports the following environment.

- Standard: IEEE 802.11 a/b/g/n
- Access method: Infrastructure mode

Check whether the wireless LAN access point supports WPS.

If it does not support WPS, check the SSID and encryption key in the manual that came with the wireless LAN access point.

- The SSID may also be called the network name, ESSID, or ESS-ID.
- The encryption key may also be called the network key, security key, password, or pre-shared key (PSK).

Directly Connecting to the Machine

Check whether your wireless terminal supports the following environment.

- Standard: IEEE 802.11 b/g/n
- Security: WPA2-PSK (AES)

Check whether your wireless terminal supports WPS-PBC (push).

If you are not sure whether it supports WPS-PBC, turn the machine on and connect manually.

Connecting via an Access Point (Infrastructure)

To choose a valid default gateway.

- ▶ Press up or down on the operator panel to display [ADMIN SETUP].
- Press the OK button.



- ▶ Enter the Admin password, and then press the OK button.
- Press∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to display [NETWORK SETUP], and then press the OK button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to display [ENABLING DEFAULT GATEWAY], and then press the «OK» button.
- ▶ Press ∨ button the operator panel to display [WIRELESS (INFRASTRUCTURE)], and then press the OK button.

Connecting Using WPS

If the wireless LAN access point supports WPS, the connection to the wireless LAN can be made easily by using the easy setup button (WPS button).

Follow the procedure below for the setup.

- Confirm the position of the easy setup button and when to press the button by referring to the user manual of the wireless LAN access point.
- Confirm that the wireless LAN access point has been activated and is functioning normally.
- Turn on the printer. When [SETUP WIRELESS?] appears, select [YES]. Proceed to Step 6.
- Press \(\) button or \(\) button on the operator panel to display [WIRELESS SETTING], and then press the OK button.
- Enter the Admin password, and then press the OK button.
 - ► The default password is 999999.
- Press up on the operator panel to select [ENABLE], and then press the OK button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to display [WPS SETUP], and then press the OK button.
- Select [WPS-PBC], and then press the OK button.
- Select [YES], and then press the OK button.
- The Printer starts searching for wireless LAN access points. During 2 minutes, press the easy setup button for the wireless LAN access point for a few seconds.

Once the setup completion screen is displayed, it indicates that the wireless LAN setup has completed.

Set the IP Address

Set a different IP address for the wireless LAN from that of the wired LAN. Enter the setting menu and make the settings by the following procedure.

- Press ∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to display [WIRELESS SETTING], and then press the OK button.
- Enter the Admin password and then press the OK button.
 - ► The default password is 999999.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to display [NETWORK SETTING], and then press the OK button.

- Press OK button when [IP ADDRESS SET] is displayed.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to select [AUTO] or [MANUAL].
 If [MANUAL] is selected, manually input the IPv4 Address, Subnet Mask and Gateway Address.

Directly Connecting to the Machine (AP Mode)

Automatic Setup (Push Button)

If the wireless terminal (computer, tablet, smartphone, etc.) supports «WPS-PBC» (push button), then you can use the WPS button to connect via wireless (AP mode).

Follow the procedure below to connect.

- Confirm the position of the WPS button in the user's manual provided with the wireless terminal (computer, tablet, smartphone, etc.).
- Turn on the printer.
 When [SETUP WIRELESS?] appears, select [NO].
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button on the operator panel to display [WIRELESS (AP MODE) SETTING], and then press the OK button.
- Enter the Admin password, and then press the OK button.
 - ► The default password is 999999.
- Select [ENABLE], and then press the OK button.
- Press button or v button on the operator panel to display [AUTOMATIC SETUP (PUSHBUTTON)], and then press the OK button.
- Select YES, and then press the OK button.
- Start WPS-PBC (push button) on the wireless terminal (computer, tablet, smartphone, etc.).

Once the setup completion screen is displayed, it indicates that the wireless LAN setup has completed.

Using Both a Wired LAN and Wireless LAN Connection

The machine can use both a wired LAN and wireless LAN connection at the same time. The available combinations are indicated in the table below



- Wireless LAN (infrastructure) and wireless LAN (AP mode) cannot be enabled at the same time.
- When wired LAN and wireless LAN are connected to the same subnet, communication may become unstable.




Connecting a USB Cable


A USB cable is not included with the machine. Prepare an A-B type cable separately.

- For Windows, do not insert the other end of the USB cable into the computer until an instruction appears on the screen during the printer driver installation.
- Prepare a USB cable.
- Make sure that the machine and the computer are turned off.
- Insert the B end of the USB cable into the USB interface connector of the machine.
 - ▶ Do not insert the USB cable into the network interface connector. Doing so may cause a malfunction.



- Insert the A end of the USB cable into the USB interface connector of the computer.
 - For Windows, do not insert the other end of the USB cable into the computer until an instruction appears on the screen during the printer driver installation.

Using the Operation Panel



Name and Function

No.	Name	Description	
1	LCD	Displays the status of the machine and the menu items. Turns off when the machine is in the Power Save mode.	
2	∧ Button	Enters the Menu mode. Returns to the previous item when the machine is in the Menu mode. Press and hold it for 1 second or more to skip forward.	
3	∨ Button	Enters the Menu mode. Proceeds to the next item when the machine is in the Menu mode. Press and hold it for 1 second or more to skip forward.	
4	«BACK» Button	Returns to the previous screen.	
5	«OK» Button	Confirms the selected item. Or confirms the set value.	
6	«POWER SAVE» Button	Enters the Power Save mode. Or cancels the Power Save mode. Lights red when the machine is in the Power Save mode.	
7	«CANCEL» Button	Stops an operation or cancels a setting.	
8	«ONLINE» Button.	Switches the machine online/offline.	
9	«FEED/CUT» Button	Cuts, ejects, and feeds the paper.	
10	POWER LED	Lights up when the power of the machine is on. However, flashes when the machine is in the Sleep mode.	
11	ONLINE LED	Lights up when the machine is online (when printing can be performed).	
12	WARNING LED	Lights up when an error has occurred in the machine. Printing is possible.	
13	ERROR LED	Flashes when an error has occurred in the machine.	

Description of the Display

The display indicates the status of the machine and the menu items, etc.

When Printing Can Be Performed

When the machine can perform printing, [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the top of the screen.



When an Error Has Occurred in the Machine

Top: Displays the solution.

Bottom: Displays the error code and error type.

For information on errors and solutions, refer to "9. Troubleshooting".



When the Machine Is in the Menu Mode

Top: Displays the category or item.

Bottom: Displays the setting when an item is displayed on the top.





The menu depth (level) is also displayed with [>].

When [>] or [>>] is displayed, there are items in a lower level.

Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.



Press \wedge button or \vee button to enter the Menu mode and display the menu categories.





Display the lower menu categories. The [>] indicating the menu depth is displayed on the bottom of the screen.



Press A button or V button several times to display the category you want to set, and press «OK» button.



• [>>] is displayed on the bottom of the screen if there are more lower menu categories.





To end the Menu mode, press «ONLINE» button, or press «BACK» button until "READY TO PRINT" is displayed.






Entering Characters

When the screen for entering the password, etc. is displayed, press \land button or \lor button to select the character to enter.

- Press ∧ button to display characters starting with lower case letters.
 - ► The characters are displayed in the following order: lower case letters → symbols → upper case letters → numbers (0 to 9)
- Press v button to display the characters in reverse order.
 - Numbers (9 to 0) \rightarrow upper case letters in reverse \rightarrow ...



Press OK button to confirm the selected character.



The cursor moves to the next digit.



Perform the same operation to enter the rest of the characters, and press OK button when all the characters have been entered.





Printing a Demonstration Page

Use cut sheet cut to the following size or continuous paper (roll paper) without a mark. The operation is not guaranteed for other paper.

- When printing on cut sheet
 - Prepare paper that is 74 mm wide and 210 mm long.
 - ▶ Print after setting [MENUS] > [FEEDER CONFIG] > [PAPER FORM] > [CUT PAPER].
- When printing on continuous paper (roll paper)
 - Prepare continuous paper (roll paper) without a mark that is 74 mm to 86 mm wide.
 - ▶ Print after setting [MENUS] > [FEEDER CONFIG] > [PAPER FORM] > [CONTINUOUS PAPER] and [MENUS] > [FEEDER CONFIG] > [CUT TYPE] > [LENGTH].
- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Load the paper.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button to display [DEMO PAGE].
- Press OK button.
- Press OK button when [DEMO1/EXECUTE] is displayed.

Adjusting the Volume

A buzzer notifies the user when an error has occurred in the machine or printing has finished.

By default, the machine is set to sound the buzzer when the paper has run out.

This section describes how to change the volume and set whether to sound the buzzer.

Setting the Volume

Available values high, low, and off.

Low is set by default.

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ several times to display [ADMIN SETUP].
- Press OK button.
- When [ENTER PASSWORD] is displayed, enter the password.
 - The default password is "999999."



- When the password has been entered, press OK button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨button several times to display [BUZZER SETUP].
- Press OK button.
- Press OK button when [ERROR VOLUME] is displayed.
- With the setting flashing, press \land button or \lor button to display the value you want to set, and press OK button.
- Confirm that "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- Press «ONLINE» button to return to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.

Setting the Volume for the Printing Complete Buzzer

The buzzer volume can be set to high, low, or off, and is set to off by default.

If the buzzer volume is set to high or low, the buzzer sounds each time a page is printed by default, regardless of the page count of the print data. You can change the buzzer to sound when printing is complete for all the pages of the print data.

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [ADMIN SETUP].
- Press «OK» button.
- When [ENTER PASSWORD] is displayed, enter the password.
 - ► The default password is "999999."
- When the password has been entered, press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [BUZZER SETUP].
- Press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [PRINT COMPLETION VOLUME].
- Press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- If [OFF] is set, proceed to the last step.
- If [LOW] or [HIGH] is set, press v button once to display [PRINT COMPLETION BUZZER].
- Press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- Press «ONLINE» button to return to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.



Checking Information About the Machine

Printing and Checking a Report

- Perform the procedure below to print and check the values set in the machine.
 - Use cut sheet cut to the following size or continuous paper (roll paper) without a mark. The operation is not guaranteed for other paper.
 - When printing on cut sheet
 - ▶ Prepare paper that is 74 mm wide and 210 mm long.
 - ▶ You can print on A4 or LETTER paper that has been cut to a quarter of its long side.
 - ▶ Print after setting [MENUS] > [FEEDER CONFIG] > [PAPER FORM] > [CUT PAPER].
 - ► When printing on continuous paper (roll paper)
 - Prepare continuous paper (roll paper) without a mark that is 74 mm to 86 mm wide.
 - ► Print after setting [MENUS] > [FEEDER CONFIG] > [PAPER FORM] > [CONTINUOUS PAPER] and [MENUS] > [FEEDER CONFIG] > [CUT TYPE] > [LENGTH].
 - Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
 - Print ∧ button or ∨ button to display [PRINT INFO].
 - Press «OK» button.
 - Press «OK» button when [CONFIGURATION/EXECUTE] is displayed.
 - Load the paper displayed on the screen in the machine.
 - Press «OK» button.

Checking the Operation Panel

You can check the print count, remaining consumables, network settings, and machine information on the operation panel.

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [CONFIGURATION].

Setting the Power Save Mode Transition Time

The machine enters the Power Save mode when it has not been used for a certain period of time. 0 minutes is set by default

Setting the Sleep Mode Transition Time

If the machine is not used for a certain period of time after it enters the Power Save mode, the machine enters the Sleep mode. 15 minutes is set by default.

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [MENUS], and press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [SYSTEM ADJUST].
- Press «OK» button.
- Display [POW SAVE TIME].
- Press ∨ button once to display [SLEEP TIME], and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- Press «ONLINE» button to return to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.

The machine does not enter the Sleep mode in the following cases.

Setting the Auto Power Off Time

If the machine is not used for a certain period of time, it automatically turns off.

By default, the machine does not automatically turn off. To make the machine automatically turn off, enable the Auto Power Off setting on the operation panel, and then set the time until the power turns off. 4 hours is set by default.

- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [ADMIN SETUP], and press «OK» button.

- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to set to [ENABLE] or [AUTO CONFIG], and press «OK» button.
- Press «ONLINE» button, or press «BACK» button until [READY TO PRINT] is displayed.

Setting the Time Until Auto Power Off

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [MENUS], and press «OK» button.

- [ENABLE INITIAL] is displayed. If [NO *] is displayed on the bottom, proceed to step 9. If [YES *] is displayed on the bottom, proceed to step 10.
- The bottom flashes when «OK» button is pressed. Press v button to display [YES] on the bottom, and press «OK» button. (The flashing stops and [YES *] is displayed.)
- Press «BACK» button once to display [STORAGE SETUP]. Press \(\text{button once to display [FLASH SETUP], and press \(\text{OK} \) button.
- Press «OK» button when [FLASH INITIALIZE / EXECUTE] is displayed.

Initializing the Settings of the Machine

The default settings of the machine can be restored. When this operation is performed, the machine automatically restarts.

- Press «OK» button.
- When [NEW PASSWORD] is displayed, enter the new password.
- When the confirmation screen is displayed, enter the same password.
- The password change is complete when [CHANGE PASSWORD] is displayed.
- Press «ONLINE» button to return to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.

Adjusting the Color Balance (Density)

You can adjust the cyan, magenta, and yellow highlights (light areas), intermediate areas, and dark areas.

This section describes the procedure for adjusting cyan. If you want to adjust other colors, perform the same operation for those colors.

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [CALIBRATION], and press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [CYAN TUNING], and press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [CYAN HIGHLIGHT] (light areas), [CYAN MID-TONE] (intermediate areas), or [CYAN DARK] (dark areas), and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press \land button or \lor button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button. Positive values are darker and negative values are lighter.
- Confirm that "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- Press «ONLINE» button to return to the [READY TO PRINT] standby status.

Correcting Color Shift

This section describes the procedure for correcting color shift on the operation panel.



Paper Storage

Store paper under the following conditions to maintain quality.


- In a dark, dry, and flat location such as inside a cabinet.
- On a flat surface
- Temperature: 20°C
- Humidity: 50% RH (relative humidity)

Do not store paper in places such as the following:

- Directly on the floor
- In a location exposed to direct sunlight
- Near the inside of an exterior wall
- On an uneven surface
- Where static electricity may be generated
- Where temperature may become excessively high or change rapidly
- Near a photocopier, air conditioner, heater, or duct
- Do not open the package of the paper until ready to use the paper.
- Do not leave paper unwrapped for a long period. Doing so may result in printing problems.
- Reduced print quality or paper curling may occur due to the paper type, usage conditions, or storage conditions.



Flow of Loading Paper



When loading of the paper is complete, start printing.

Setting Paper Information on the Operation Panel

Use the operation panel to set the information for the paper to use to the machine.

Set the information in the following order: paper format → paper size → paper weight → cut type → cut position

Paper Format

For roll paper or continuous paper folded along a perforation (z-fold), set [CONTINUOUS PAPER]. For paper cut into single sheets, set [CUT PAPER].

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button several times to display [MENUS], and press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button to display [FEEDER CONFIG], and press «OK» button.
- Press ∧ button or ∨ button to display [PAPER FORM], and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that the setting stops flashing and "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.

Paper Size

You can set 25.0 mm to 86.0 mm (1.00 inches to 3.40 inches) for the width and 3.0 mm to 551 mm (2.10 inches to 21.70 inches) for the length.

- Press ∨ button once to display [X DIMENSION], and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that the setting stops flashing and "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- Press v button once to display [Y DIMENSION], and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that the setting stops flashing and "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.

Paper Weight

Set the weight of the paper to use. You can set LIGHT, MEDIUM LIGHT, MEDIUM, MEDIUM HEAVY, HEAVY, ULTRA HEAVY1, ULTRA HEAVY2.

- Press ∨ button once to display [MEDIAWEIGHT], and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that the setting stops flashing and "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.



Cut Type

Set the type of mark used for cutting the paper. Set it according to the paper to use.

When the paper has a black mark on the surface that is printed on: B/M(FRONT) When the paper has a black mark on the surface that is not printed on: B/M(BACK) For paper with a hole in the center: CENTER HOLE For paper without a hole in the center: SIDE HOLE For label stock with GAP set to: CENTER HOLE

For paper without a mark: LENGTH

- Press v button once to display [CUTTYPE], and press «OK» button.
- With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
- Confirm that the setting stops flashing and "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
- If you set [LENGTH], proceed to step 23. If you set something other than [LENGTH], proceed to step 20.

Cut Position

This setting specifies the cut position of paper with a black mark or hole. When set to 0 mm, the paper is cut at the center of the black mark or hole. The values that can be set are indicated below.

Paper with a black mark: -6.5 mm (-0.25 inches) to the paper length Paper with a hole: -6.5 mm to 6.5 mm (-0.25 inches to 0.25 inches)

- Generally set this to 0 mm when printing on paper with a hole. If the paper cannot be cut in the center of the hole, change the setting.
 - Press v button twice to display [CUT POSITION SET], and press «OK» button.
 - With the setting flashing, press ∧ button or ∨ button to display the value you want to set, and press «OK» button.
 - Confirm that "*" is displayed to the right of the value you want to set.
 - Press «ONLINE» button, or press «BACK» button until "READY TO PRINT" is displayed.

Setting the Paper Sensors

The position for setting the paper sensors differs according to the paper to use. Adjust the paper sensors while checking the position based on the table below.



A paper jam will be incorrectly detected if the sensor position and cut type setting of the machine do not match. In this case, change the position of the top sensor and bottom sensor so that they do not overlap if their positions were matching or to match if their positions were overlapped.


Loading Paper



Set the roll paper its side on a flat surface so that it dose not roll or fall. Dropping a roll paper may cause injury.

- Be careful not to soil the printing surface of the roll paper. The print quality may deteriorate.
- It is recommended to wear and handle clean cloth gloves etc. to protect the printing surface of the roll paper.
- Align the edges of the paper on both ends of the roll paper. This may cause paper feed problems.






Before loading the roll paper, remove any paper from the paper inlet unit.

- Do not load the roll paper in the opposite direction.
- If a feeding problem occurs, reload the roll paper.

 When the roll paper is in one of the following conditions, cut off the edge of the paper with scissors before loading it. This may cause paper feed problems and affect the printing quality.

The leading edge of the roll paper is damaged.	Adhesive tape, glue or dirt is sticking to the roll paper.
The roll paper is wrinkled.	The corners of the roll paper are folded.
The roll paper curls in the opposite direction to the rolling direction.	The edge of the roll paper is dented.






- When cutting the leading edge of the paper with scissors, cut the paper vertically to the feed direction, so that it can be fed into the machine.

Execute feeding in the following cases. Printing may not be able to be performed correctly unless feeding is performed.

- When paper is set in the machine again because it had run out, etc.
- When paper was cut at the appropriate position because of a paper jam, etc.
- When the cut position setting is changed

When the tip of the paper is dirty, performing paper feeding to cut off the dirty part with the paper still loaded in the machine.

When the paper to print on has been changed to another paper type, execute sensor calibration.


- Confirm that paper is loaded in the machine.
- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.



Press «FEED/CUT» button.

When a paper jam occurs during printing, the paper may be removed from the machine in order to clear the paper jam.

When paper is set in the machine again after clearing a paper jam, a screen similar to the following is displayed. Press «FEED/CUT» button while this screen is displayed to execute paper feeding.

Register the information for the paper to use.

- Click [Start], and select [Control Panel] in [Windows System].
- Click [View devices and printers].
- Right-click the [cCX86e PCL6] icon, and select [Printing Preferences].
- Click [User-defined paper] on the [Setup] tab.



Enter the information for the paper to register.

- (1) Select [New Paper] from [Registered User-defined paper].
- (2) Enter the paper name in [Paper Name].
- (3) Select the paper format.
- (4) Select the cut type.
- (5) Select the paper type.
- (6) Select the paper weight.
- (7) Enter the paper size information.
 - ▶ Enter the paper size information after measuring the paper with a ruler, where possible.
 - ► Select [Hole Position Center)] if the paper has a hole in the center.

Click [Add] when all the information has been entered.

Adjusting the Paper Sensors (Sensor Calibration)

If paper jams or paper mark detection errors occur frequently, follow the procedure below to perform sensor calibration.

It adjusts the paper sensors to the position suitable for the paper to use.



For details, refer to "Setting the Paper Sensors".



The paper sensors cannot be correctly calibrated unless they are in a suitable position.

- Confirm that [READY TO PRINT] is displayed on the machine.
- Click [Start] on the computer, and select [Control Panel] in [Windows System].
- Click [View devices and printers].
- Right-click the [CX86e PCL6] icon, and select [Printing Preferences].
- Click [Sensor Calibration...] on the [Setup] tab.
- Remove the paper from the machine when [Would you like to execute sensor calibration] is displayed.
- Click [Execute] on the printer driver screen of the computer.
- Load the paper in the machine when [PLEASE LOAD PAPER] is displayed on the screen of the machine.
- The procedure is complete when [READY TO PRINT] is displayed.



- Remove the paper in the machine when [PLEASE REMOVE PAPER] is displayed on the screen. Failing to do so will cause a paper detection error. The paper detection error can be cleared by opening and closing the cover.
- Sensor calibration cannot be performed from the printer driver while the machine has print data or while [PLEASE LOAD PAPER] is displayed on the screen.
- An execution error occurs unless paper is loaded within one minute of [PLEASE LOAD PAPER] being displayed. The execution error can be cleared by opening and closing the cover.
- When you change the paper to use, it is recommended that you execute sensor calibration.



Printing from a Computer

Wordpad is used here as an example.

- Load the paper.
 - For details, refer to "Chapter 5 Loading Paper".
- Open the file to print.
- Select [Print] from the [File] menu.
- Select [CX86e] as the printer, and click [Preferences].
- Select the paper to use in [Paper Settings] on the [Setup] tab.
 - If the paper to use does not exist, click [User-defined paper] and register the paper. For details, refer to "Registering Paper Information to the Printer Driver".
- Select the items to set on each tab, and click [OK].
- Click [Print].




Cleaning the Surface of the Machine

• Turn off the machine.




For information on turning off the machine, refer to "Turning Off the Machine".

• Wipe the surface of the machine with a cloth that has been moistened with water or neutral detergent and squeezed well.



• Wipe the surface of the machine with a dry soft cloth.




Cleaning the LED Head

Clean the LED head if white lines or black lines appear, images are faded, or the periphery of letters are smudged in the printouts.




- Do not use solvents, such as methyl alcohol or thinners. They may damage the LED head.
- Do not expose the image drum unit to direct sunlight or strong light (approximately 1,500 lux or more). When leaving the image drum unit under room lighting for five minutes or more or leaving the top cover open, cover it with a black cloth or paper to prevent it from being exposed to light.
- Insert your finger into the recess on the top of the machine and pull up the lever.






• Open the top cover until it stops.




• Cover the image drum unit with black paper, etc. so that it is not exposed to light.



• Wipe the three lenses of the LED heads with a soft tissue lightly.




• Remove the black paper, etc. on the image drum unit, and close the top cover.




Cleaning the Feed Rollers


• Insert your finger into the recess on the top of the machine and pull up the lever.



• Open the top cover until it stops.








• Hold the blue handle and pull out the image drum unit vertically.


Pull it out after opening the top cover fully.




- Place the image drum unit you took out on a flat surface and cover it with black paper, etc. so that the image drums are not exposed to light.
- Hold the handle (black) of the transfer belt unit and pull it out vertically.
- Insert your fingers in the both ends of the recess in the center bottom of the back of the machine interior, and turn down the sensor lever towards yourself.
- Wipe the feed roller with a soft cloth that has been moistened with water and then squeezed well.

Cleaning the Paper Feed Rollers


• Turn the machine to make its rear side face to you.

When the LED Lights Up

When a problem occurs in the machine, the ERROR LED or WARNING LED lights up or flashes and a message is displayed on the screen.






Since the fuser unit gets hot, carry out the operation carefully, and make sure to hold it by the handle when lifting it up. When it is hot, do not attempt to carry out the operations. Wait until it is cooled down and then carry out the operations.







• Gently pull the paper out to the back of the fuser unit (the opposite direction from the paper feed direction).



• Align the red ▲ on the right side of the fuser and the red ▼ in the machine, and lower it vertically, and return it to its original position in the machine.



Canceling Printing

Canceling from a Computer

You can cancel printing from a computer when a large amount of data has been accidentally sent to the printer.

- Click [Devices and Printers].
- Right-click the icon for the printer, and select [See print jobs].
- Select the file name to cancel printing for.
- Press the <Delete> key on the keyboard.
- Check the display of the control panel.
- Printing can be canceled from the operation panel of the machine when "PROCESSING" or "DATA" is displayed.

You can encrypt the communication between the computer and the machine. Communication is encrypted via SSL/TLS in the following cases. A certificate is installed in the machine by default, which enables communication using HTTPS to be performed.

Creating a Certificate

A certificate can be used when sending data to the machine on the network.

This section describes how to create a certificate using the Web page.

The following two types of certificates can be created.

- Self-signed certificate
 A certificate issued by the machine.
- CA certificate
 A certificate issued and signed by an external certificate authority for the CSR (certificate signature request) created by the machine.

- If an IP address was set in the [Common Name] of the certificate, the certificate is disabled if the IP address of the printer is changed after creating the certificate. Create the certificate again.

- ▶ If the certificate is a self-signed certificate, follow the on-screen instructions to close the Web page, and proceed to "Enabling Encryption."
- ▶ To retrieve a certificate issued by a certificate authority, proceed to step 7.

Follow the on-screen instructions to send the CSR to the certificate authority.

Click [OK].

Follow the on-screen instructions to install the certificate from the certificate authority.

Click [Submit].

Proceed to "Enabling Encryption."

• Importing a Certificate and Private Key

This section describes how to import a certificate and private key using the Web page.

A certificate and private key that have been issued can be imported in order to use a certificate issued by an external certificate authority.

When encryption is enabled, the communication is immediately encrypted after the setting is changed from the Web page.

In order to enable the computer to request the certificate of the machine, import the certificate of the machine that has been exported to the certificate store of the computer.

• The DVD-ROM drive is set to the D drive in the above example.

Select the INF file, and click [Open].

Click [OK].

Select the model, and click [OK].

Click [Next].

Click [Complete].

When installation is complete, print a test page.



Encrypting Communication (IPSec)

You can encrypt the communication between the computer and the machine.

The communication is encrypted with IPSec. When IPSec is enabled, all applications use IPSec for encryption.

50 hosts can be specified with an IP address. Access to the machine from unregistered hosts is refused. Access to unregistered hosts is also disabled.

Configure the computer after configuring the machine.

The pre-shared key must be prepared in advance.

Configuring the Machine

In order to enable IPSec, the Web page must first be used to configure the machine.



- IPSec communication is performed when IPSec is configured for both the printer and the host. IPSec communication is not performed unless IPSec is configured for the host.
- Make a note of the value specified in this procedure. It is required for configuring IPSec on the computer. Open the Web page of this machine.


